General Daniel Butterfield (1831-1901) is the man identified as responsible for the bugle call known as Taps. Taps has been used at all military funerals. Prior to modern forms of communications, bugles were used to signal troop activity during times of battle. A distinctive call was used to wake soldiers (Reveille), call them to eat, engage in battle (i.e.: the Calvary Charge) and for lights out. Research has shown that Butterfield did not compose Taps, but revised an earlier bugle call known as Tattoo used at the end of the day.

General Butterfield died in 1901 and was buried at West Point, even though he did not attend the Academy. There is also a monument to him in New York City, near Grant's Tomb. Neither of these monuments mentions his association with Taps.

There are no official words for Taps, although there are several verses, including the most popular:

### TAPS

Day is done, gone the sun from the lake, from the hill, from the sky.

All is well, safely rest. God is nigh.

Thanks and praise for our days 'neath the sun, 'neath the stars, 'neath the sky.
As we go, this we know, God is nigh.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our Country, in its intercourse with other countries, may she always be right, but our country, right or wrong".

The **sixth** fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation, under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The **seventh** fold is a tribute to our Armed Forces, for it is through the Armed Forces that we protect our country and our flag against all her enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The **eighth** fold is a tribute to the ones who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day.
